Pointers for transcription or analysis:

M used the phrase 'Hall of mirrors' when talking about her identity when learning and reflecting on qualitative research. It was in relation to the meta aspects of teaching qualitative research methods. This was related to learning to recognise the value of peer expertise. Challenges and solutions, the format of learning was through stories. I asked more about that. Look out for comment of 'without the story what are you? You're just a bunch of facts/information'. The intimate space of qualitative research allows or gives us social permission to ask questions that one doesn't normally ask or be allowed to ask. This makes me think of social scripting - there is a lot of social scripting of what constitutes a researcher that does not seem to be matched by the reality of what is reflected in these researcher journeys.
